

# 1987-93 MUSTANG FRONT ADJUSTABLE PARKING BRAKE CABLE KIT INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

## Instructions

1. Remove the center console armrest (**Figure A**) and shifter bezel, then uninstall the retaining bolts located behind the parking brake handle to remove the top panel (**Figure B**).

2. Loosen the hex head screw securing the parking brake light switch to the assembly. Remove the ground wire as well.

3. Remove the two 10mm parking brake assembly retaining bolts.

4. Remove the factory front cable from the assembly. Push up on the cable to free the eyelet from the recessed groove. Remove the assembly. (**Figure C**)

5. Using a cutoff wheel, cut off the small tab from the self-adjusting spring. Then, cut off the top tab. This will allow the handle to sit parallel with the floor when unengaged.

6. Weld the paw to the handle with the second-to-last tooth engaged on the gear drive. (We recommend having this done by a professional welder.) (**Figure D**)

7. Take the new cable and attach the floor seal. Run the cable through the assembly, placing the eyelet inside the recessed groove. (**Figure E**)



8. Bring the assembly back to the car and run the new cable through the floor opening. Reinstall the assembly, then reattach the ground wire and hex head screw.

9. From underneath the car, slide the union on the threaded portion, then twist on – but do not tighten – the two included jam nuts. For 1987-92 models, you will use the wide union. For 1993 models, you will use the shorter one. **(Figure F)**

10. Install the rear parking brake cables. Route them through the guides and hook the eyelets into the union. Then, run up the first jam nut to apply tension to the cable. Once tension is achieved, run up the second jam nut and tighten to secure.

11. Test your parking brake and make any needed adjustments.
