The article supersedes TSB 12-2-1 to update the model years, Issue Statement and Part List.

ISSUE

Some 2005-2011 Mustang vehicles with the axle vent on the right (passenger) side may exhibit a heavy fluid leak from the rear axle vent after hard acceleration.

ACTION

Follow the Service Procedure steps to correct the condition.

SERVICE PROCEDURE

- 1. Inspect the rear drive axle assembly for an oil leak from the rattle cap vent located on the passenger side axle tube.
 - a. If oil is dripping from the axle tube vent, a service replacement vent is available to correct this condition. Proceed to Step 2.
 - b. If only light oil residue is around the rattle cap vent, this is normal and do not proceed with this procedure.
- 2. Remove and discard the rattle cap vent from the axle tube. Clean any oil residue from the axle tube using isopropyl alcohol or suitable cleaner.
- 3. Install Differential Vent and torque to 20 N•m (15 lb-ft).
- 4. Refer to Workshop Manual, Section 205-02. Remove differential fill plug and inspect fluid level. Adjust fluid level to the bottom of the fill plug, if necessary. Tighten fill plug to 30 N•m (22 lb-ft).
